R/C Gloves - A Canadian Perspective

No pair of gloves that I have tried over the years has had the tactile performance to enable me to fly my R/C models until I tried R/C Gloves.

My first test, immediately after opening the envelope, was an easy-to-fly indoor coaxial helicopter in my warm living room; I could easily feel the sticks under my thumbs so felt comfortable moving to phase 2 - outdoors. BTW: I am a mode 2, "thumb flyer".

March 18, 2014: approx. 07:50, shortly after sunrise: -6C, no wind. Maiden flight for my UMX Carbon Cub; set up and flight duration ~10

minutes then rush off to work. The gloves kept my hands sufficiently warm and I was able to feed in corrective trim and comfortably fly the model. I felt I could probably have flown much longer with the gloves on but was already running late.

March 22, 2014: approx. 09:00, temperature -17C, ~5km/h breeze. After a full 10 minutes (including a brief stop to adjust sub-trim) I was still able to fly the Carbon Cub with ease, but my fingers behind the Tx definitely felt they were reaching their limit; I doubt I'd have made the 15 min mark.



March 23, 2014: approx. 10:30, temperature -10C, no wind. Similar results to March 18. Flew out a full battery and could easily have continued indefinitely with no problem. As a control, I swapped battery and removed the gloves. Without gloves I lasted about 3 minutes. R/C Gloves definitely work in these conditions.

Conclusion

There are certainly much cheaper, warmer gloves on the market but I have yet to find any gloves that I personally can use for R/C flying. As I have aged (58), I have found that my fingers stiffen in the cold - to the point that winter flying has unfortunately become indoors-only activity for me. R/C Gloves will enable me to fly outdoors again, comfortably in the -5C to -10C range with some wind.

<u>Disclosure</u>: Kevin at R/C gloves provided a test pair at reduced price to "return them if I don't like them or keep if I liked them and write a report on their low temperature performance". This is the report; and the semi-quantitative results are valid for me. I do like them. They're not perfect but are much easier and better to use than the "transmitter muff" type over the Tx muff. I'm keeping the gloves!

CARFF BYLAWS NEW PARA.

- III MEMBERSHIPS
 - a) <u>Regular Member:</u> carries with it the full rights to vote, run for office and use of the CARFF facilities for flying of model aircrafts and related activities.
 - b) <u>Junior Member</u>: a person under the age of 18 as of the first of the membership year, not part of a family membership and must be sponsored by a current CARFF member.
 - c) <u>Family Membership</u>: Husband, wife and all the children under 18 years of age. This carries all the rights of full membership.
 - d) <u>Leader Member</u>: Regular member who is being recognized for special service and
 - contributions to the club. This member will pay the regular membership fees, has the right to vote, run for office as well as fly. Must be nominated by five members in good standing and ratified by a majority vote of the members at a regular meeting. The nomination shall state the reasons for awarding this honor.
 - e) <u>Honorary Member</u>: Can be by nomination signed by one member in good standing. As part of the nomination, reasons for appointing this honour will have to be given and nomination approved by a majority vote of the members attending at a regular meeting. This members does not pay dues, cannot vote at any meeting and cannot hold office, as well this member will not be a flying member.
 - i.e. automatic for past presidents as an example. The criteria for such automatic appointment needs to be discussed and decided upon by the club members.
 - f) The annual membership fees for each class of membership will be set the membership when setting annual the budget.
 - g) All flying members must be a member in good standing of the Model Aeronautics Association of Canada (MAAC)




In the past month or so I have been experimenting with a couple of new products. The first, R/C Gloves (www.rcgloves.com) from the UK, is the subject of this month's feature article. While they are expensive, I have found them to be excellent and I really like them. I understand they are on sale right now.

The second item is a new glue by LePage: it's called 100% Glue and is compatible with polystyrene foam, wood and most modelling materials. With no water or solvents to evaporate there is no shrinkage to pull things out of alignment or water to swell & warp balsa laminations. While not super strong and requiring 24h to develop full strength, it is has found a place on my workbench.
